While we still have a few more weeks of Lent, Easter is fast approaching along with the traditional Holy Week services, beginning with Palm Sunday. The Paschal Triduum will all begin at 7:00 p.m. with Maundy Thursday service, including the Holy Eucharist, followed by Good Friday for the Veneration of the Cross, then Holy Saturday which observes the Great Vigil of Easter.

Easter Sunday begins with the Easter Sunrise Eucharist at 6:30, followed by breakfast at 8:00, and Sunday School at 9:15 with an Easter Egg Hunt for Pre-K to sixth grade. The Holy Eucharist will be celebrated again at the 10:30 service.

The Jolly Bunch, Zion's groups for seniors, will meet on Wednesday, April 19th (NOTE change of week). There will be a surprise program followed by lunch at the Allenwood Café.

The Stewardship Committee is once again sponsoring "The Great American Cleanup" on Saturday, April 22. Anyone who wishes to be part of a group should meet at the church at 8:00 a.m. Gloves, vests, and bags will be available at the church, and volunteers are asked to register. Collected bags will be taken to the Lycoming Landfill and anyone who wishes to pick up on their own are asked to call the church office (570-649-5195) for pick-up of their bags. Last year Pennsylvania reported that nearly 159,000 people worked to make our state a cleaner one. Great job, folks!

The Youth Group will observe a 30 hour famine on Friday and Saturday, April 28 and 29 to raise funds to fight global hunger through World Vision. Youth will begin fasting after breakfast on Friday and will gather at the church at 6:00 p.m. The overnight session will include videos, Bible Study, and games to learn about hunger. A nutritious meal will end the fast for departure by 2:00 p.m. on Saturday. Donations will be sought within the congregation and individually from family and friends.

Youth Groups will also serve the Mother's Day Dinner on Sunday, May 7. Anyone wishing to attend may purchase their ticket at the church office. There will also be entertainment.

KEEPING PENNSYLVANIA BEAUTIFUL

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF TURBOTVILLE, NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AMENDING PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 88-4 PERTAINING TO THE RESTRICTION OF CERTAIN VEHICLES AND REFUSE DUMPSTERS IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS AND ON STREETS, ALLEYS, HIGHWAYS, ROADWAYS, OR WAYS IN THE BOROUGH OF TURBOTVILLE AND PROVIDING PENALTIES THERETO

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Turbotville, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same as follows:SECTION 1.

Section I. Definitions, is hereby amended by adding the following definition: g. Trailer – Any wheeled vehicle on which an object or objects can be carried and/or transported and is towed by a motorized vehicle. SECTION 2. Section III. of the Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section III.A. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation, or any agent thereof, to park a truck, tractor, truck tractor trailer, truck tractor semi-trailer, a combination truck tractor and truck tractor trailer, semi-trailer, a truck classified by the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code, as amended, as a Class 4 or higher, a bus, camper, motor home, or trailer on any streets, alleys, highways, roadways, or ways situate within the Borough of Turbotville. Section III..B. It shall be unlawful for any vehicle to be parked on any of the streets, alleys, highways, roadways or ways within the Borough of Turbotville without a valid vehicle license and a current inspection sticker. Section III.C. It shall be unlawful for a person, firm or corporation or agent thereof to place a refuse dumpster in any street, alley, highway, roadway or way situate in the Borough of Turbotville without first obtaining a permit from the Borough Secretary with a time limit specified in the permit for occupying the space and also paying the cost for the permit as determined by Resolution of the Borough Council.

SECTION 3. All other provisions of said Ordinance 88-4 shall remain in full force and effect except as amended hereby.
