This past year has seen several improvements to the Turbotville Community Hall. Last summer, Fred Yeagle and his crew cleaned and sealed the asphalt parking area and around to the back doors. They also restriped the parking lines as well as the handicap symbols. This spring, Joe Davis repaired the auditorium emergency exit steps and parged the outside walls. For the finishing touch, Nathan Clemens installed new aluminum railing on the porches and steps. What a difference this work made to the over-all look of the Hall! This project was funded in part by the Ralph & Josephine Smith Fund of the First Community Foundation of Pennsylvania, and partly by the Turbotville Community Hall Corporation (TCHC).

Our group is committed to the complete renovation and refurbishing of the Turbotville Community Hall.
