Next Meeting: Tuesday, October 12th at 7:00 pm in the Community Hall.

Since late 2009, the heritage society has worked diligently to bring the train station back to Turbotville and restore and rebuild the station and make it a focal point of the Community Park. So far, we have been able to use the freight dock on the front of the station the past 3 years for the Turbotville Community Carnival's nightly entertainment. Also, the exterior outlets on the front of the station have provided power in order to show the movies in the park. We are hoping that we will be having more events next year that will allow us to have the interior of the train station open and allow visitors inside more often to see the historical display of items that have been donated. Our goal is to have more hours of operation for the train station and provide access to the historical displays inside. In order to do that, we need volunteers that are interested in giving some of their time to open the train station for visitors during set hours. We would like to get a schedule prepared for 2017 in order to announce what days the train station would be open to the public. If anyone in the community has an interest in local history and would like to be part of this venture, please contact Michael. Ideally, having some Saturday or Sunday hours where the train station could be open to the public would be ideal. We are willing to work around what hours any volunteers are available to assist with promoting the train station and our town's historical past. We are also working on at least one event for 2017 that would be a fundraiser for the train station. If anyone has any ideas, please let us know? If any local bands would like to use the train station to provide music in the park, if you are a member of a train club and would like to tour the train station or hold a meeting in the park with the train station as your backdrop, please let us know. We will do our best to accommodate your needs and requests.

Our Turbotville commemorative items are still available, with the exception of size large t-shirts which are sold out. We still have the Milton Car Works book we are selling in conjunction with the Milton Model Train Museum. Half the proceeds of the sale of this book benefit both the museum and the Turbotville Train Station. Also, Robert Swope, Jr's series of historical picture books are available for Turbotville, Watsontown, and Washingtonville, in either softcover or hardcover. And, the Turbotville 1859-2009 book is also available. You can contact Michael for any of the items, including flyswatters, yardsticks, limited edition signed and numbered Raymond Weaver "Turbotville Train Station" prints, and the wooden replica blocks of the Turbotville National Bank.
