September will be a very busy month at Zion.....here are the highlights. The fall church season will kick off with Loyalty Sunday Weekend September 9 and 10. At our August 14th meeting, the public and Grange members enjoyed a presentation by Dick Hess, retired Wildlife Specialist from the Montour Preserve on the topic "Monarch Butterflies, their life cycle and habitat". Mr. Hess's fascinating wildlife photography was highlighted in his audio/ visual presentation that explained how the butterflies we see in central PA migrate to central Mexico and over winter before returning the following year. He also stressed the importance of providing milk-weed habitat to support healthy Monarch butterfly populations in central PA.
